

Our 2022 Leadership Conference centered around the theme of Finding Your Balance, with talks centered around easing stress and making confident, productive decisions to ensure their successes.

We saw conference attendance increase 100% from the previous year, with 30 students attending from: Warren, Shenandoah, Frederick and Hardy counties, and Winchester City.

Students enjoyed breakfast and lunch, a variety of speakers, participated in a panel discussion, and took a tour of the Shenndoah University campus. We were also able to award two students with \$100 scholarships.



LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The 2022 / 2023 school year was a year of big changes for the YES Leadership program and our students.

We officially entered into a partnership with Shenandoah University, which granted us the opportunity to have a consistent accessible space for our workshop dates, as well as opening up new opportunities for mentors and collaboration within our Valley.



The group had tons of new experiences, including assisting in a river cleanup day on the Shenandoah with the Rotary club, the opportunity to lay wreaths in Arlington Cemetary, our girls were able to attend the Lavish Sisterhood Conference, and five students were sponsored to attend the 2023 Rotary Youth Leadership Conference.

Finally, two of our students graduated this year and we could not be more proud of their achievements. Samuel Barber and Laynee Scholtz both graduated from Skyline High School and are attending Shenandoah University and the College of William and Mary, respectively. Samuel is majoring in Engineering and Laynee is majoring in International Affairs. Congratulations to them both and we can't wait to see what they do next!


